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Intent of the FLAM Project

The partnership undertook a mission of developing and implementing the concept of a multicultural teaching approach as a new strategy and method in teaching, to be put into practice through workshops for trainers, teachers and other educational staff. Besides that the partnership promotes the importance of cultural awareness and sustainability of cultural and linguistic diversity, cultural backgrounds, and it provides reflection to increase tolerance and reduce prejudice and xenophobia.



Content

The handbook gives a theoretical overview of the topics Europe and its cultural diversity, conceptions and philosophical foundations of a multicultural approach and the latest scientific research findings in the field of integration through education and vocational guidance. It outlines the concept of intercultural communication and the impact of social, cultural and family factors on intercultural communication.



“FLAM – feel like a migrant – multicultural approach in teaching”

is the title of the handbook, the main product of the partnership, which has been developed by all members in common. It provides background materials on multicultural teaching, for trainers, teachers and counselors working with migrants. Theoretical resources as well as practical tools are offered to be used in the context of multicultural teaching environments.



Structure of the Handbook

Because of its modular structure the handbook can be used for a wide variety of measures like in-service training courses, courses to raise teaching competences and skills, it can be also used as self education tool for teachers, trainers and other staff. Some of the tools can be used during in-service trainings for teachers, trainers, educators or as activities for self-reflection, either in the form of a written assignment or a discussion during the training course. The handbook includes also tools which can be used directly during the trainings/courses with migrant learners.

Module 4: Multicultural teaching approach and strategy
